- **Entries close at 9pm on Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> June**, and should be submitted by phone, text, or email to contact below.
- Exhibits may be staged on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June between 2pm and 7pm or on Saturday morning between 7.30am and 9.45am.
- Judging takes place at 10am on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> June.
- Each exhibit will be given a Class Card which must be placed face down under the exhibit to which it relates. In the case of Children's Classes, age should be written on the back of the card so that the Judge can take this into account.
- Exhibits must not be removed before the close of the show at 6pm on Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> June.
- All exhibits must be the bona fide production of the Exhibitor and named as far as possible.
- A competitor may not enter more than one exhibit in any class, unless otherwise stated.
- There is no entry fee, except for the six All Ireland Qualifier Championships which is €3 at this show and €6 at the final.
- Sweet Pea, Roses & Cut Flowers must be shown in vases provided.
- We will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any exhibit before, during or after the Show, but all reasonable care shall be exercised.
- The Judges decision will be final.

**Sweet Pea**



- 100 Sweet Pea, 9 stems, mixed varieties, one vase.
- 101 Sweet Pea, 1 stem, any variety.
- 102 Sweet Pea, 6 stems, one variety, one vase.
- 103 Sweet Pea, 6 stems, mixed varieties, one vase (**1<sup>st</sup> €20, 2<sup>nd</sup> €10**)
- 104 Bowl of Sweet Pea, not more than 15 stems.
- 105 Bowl of old-fashioned sweet peas, not more than 12 stems, not cordon grown, no Spencers, with any foliage. To be judged for quality and decorative effect.

**Roses**

- 115 Rose, large flowered (H.T.), single stem.
- 116 Roses, large flowered (H.T.) 3 stems, may be mixed (**1<sup>st</sup> €20, 2<sup>nd</sup> €10**)
- 117 Rose, Cluster Flower (Floribunda) single stem.
- 118 Roses, Cluster Flower (Floribunda), 3 stems, may be mixed.
- 119 Single Rose, to be displayed in Picture Frame (supplied).
- 120 Any other Rose.



## Cut Flowers

- 130 Viola, 5 blooms, may be mixed, in container & tubes provided.
- 131 Pansy, 5 blooms, may be mixed, in container & tubes provided.
- 132 Pelargoniums (Geraniums), 1 vase, 3 stems.
- 133 Carnations, 1 vase, 3 stems.
- 134 Bowl of floating flowers (exhibitor to provide bowl).
- 135 Hosta leaves, 3 different varieties, 3 vases.
- 136 Begonias (Tuberous), 3 blooms on a board or tray.
- 137 Any flowering shrub, 1 vase.
- 138 Collection of Cut Flowers, excluding sweet pea, 1 vase mixed (**1<sup>st</sup> €20, 2<sup>nd</sup> €10**)
- 139 Hardy Herbaceous Flowers, 1 vase, mixed.
- 140 Hanging basket or hanging pot (**1<sup>st</sup> €20, 2<sup>nd</sup> €10**)
- 141 Planted container.
- 142 Planted window box, maximum size 90cm/3'



## Pot Plants

- 201 Pelargonium (Geranium), max pot size 7" (**1<sup>st</sup> €20, 2<sup>nd</sup> €10**)
- 202 Impatiens, Busy Lizzie, max pot size 7".
- 203 Fuchsia, max pot size 7".
- 204 Begonia, max pot size 12".
- 205 Any foliage plant, max pot size 10".
- 206 Cactus, max pot size 7".
- 207 Succulent, max pot size 7".
- 208 Flowering plants, 3 pots, max pot sizes 10" (**1<sup>st</sup> €20 + Perpetual Silver Salver in honour of Madaleine Harford, 2<sup>nd</sup> €10**)
- 209 Any other pot plant not provided for, max pot size 10".



## Vegetables & Fruit

- 300 French Beans, plate of 5.
- 301 Cabbage, 1 head.
- 302 Peas, plate of 5.
- 303 Broad Beans, plate of 5.
- 304 Potatoes, plate of 5.
- 305 Lettuce, 1 head.
- 306 Scallions, bunch of 6 (no bulb).
- 307 Turnips, plate of 3.
- 308 Parsley, 5 stalks in a vase.
- 309 Rhubarb, 5 sticks.
- 310 Any other vegetable not provided for (up to 3 entries allowed provided they are different).
- 311 Selection of vegetables on a board, max size 3'x 2', not more than 5 varieties (**1<sup>st</sup> €20, 2<sup>nd</sup> €10**)
- 312 A plate of fruit, one or more varieties.



## Home Baking

- 400 Tea Brack.
- 401 Soda Bread.
- 402 Brown Bread.
- 403 Scones, plate of 5 (**1<sup>st</sup> €20, 2<sup>nd</sup> €10**)
- 404 Apple Tart.
- 405 Biscuits or tray bakes, plate of 5.
- 406 Jam or Marmalade, named & dated. (up to 3 entries allowed provided they are different).
- 407 Any other Preserve e.g. Chutneys. (up to 3 entries allowed provided they are different).
- 408 Any other Bread e.g. Banana, Herb



## Handcrafts

- 501 Hand knitting, any garment (**1<sup>st</sup> €20, 2<sup>nd</sup> €10**)
- 502 Crochet, any item.
- 503 Embroidery or Needlework.
- 504 Soft Toy or novelty item.
- 505 Painting or Drawing in any medium.

(All entries must have been produced in the last 12 months and only one entry is allowed in each class)

- 601 Space allowed 60cm approx.
- 602 Petite exhibit - Space allowed 25cm width & depth, 37cm height (**1<sup>st</sup> €20, 2<sup>nd</sup> €10**)

## Children under 9 years (on day of show)

- 801 Miniature Garden in a container, or biscuit tin. Maximum size 35cm x 35cm approx.
- 802 Model made from any or all of the following: fruit, vegetables, flowers, foliage.
- 803 Best dressed hard-boiled egg.
- 804 A vase of wildflowers.
- 805 Display of 6 named leaves.
- 806 Painting or drawing of a flower, A4 size.



## Children under 15 years (on day of show)

- 810 Miniature Garden in a container, or biscuit tin. Maximum size 35cm x 35cm approx.
- 811 Model made from any or all of the following: fruit, vegetables, flowers, foliage.
- 812 Homemade Traybakes, 3 on a plate.
- 813 Painting or drawing of a flower, A4 size.
- 814 Any vegetable that you have grown yourself.
- 815 Handcrafts, any item.

### Rules

1. This competition is to encourage growers to exhibit produce from their own kitchen garden.
2. The produce should be the property of and be grown by the exhibitor.
3. Foliage and root growth may be trimmed for display purposes and herbs may be included.
4. The veg and fruit should be displayed within an area not larger than 610mm x 610mm (24"x24") & no exceed 90cm (3') high. However, foliage and roots may extend beyond that boundary but not rest on the show bench.

#### **THE COMPETITION WILL BE JUDGED AS FOLLOWS:**

Variety: 25 points

Condition and quality: 50 points

Overall presentation and attractiveness: 25 points

A dish of 6 potatoes of any variety

### Rules

1. In this competition the produce must be the property of and be grown by the Exhibitor.
2. The variety to be correctly named. Each tuber should be free from skin blemishes, be true to type, and weigh approximately 6 ozs. (170g).
3. Two exhibits may qualify for the final in Tullamore, if the Judges agree that the standard is high enough.
4. This being a quality championship, the adjudicators will favour floury, high dry matter varieties, which are popular with the Irish customer.

## THE QUALITY ONION ALL IRELAND CHAMPIONSHIP

A dish of 5 onions of any variety

### Rules

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1. In this competition, the produce must be the property of and grown by the exhibitor.
2. Each exhibit is to consist of a dish of 5 onions of any variety.
3. The onions may be grown from either seed or sets.
4. The onions may be Autumn or Spring sown. The variety to be correctly named.
5. Each onion must be tied and weigh not more than 450grams.
6. The onions to be harvested and have clear unbroken skins.
7. Two exhibits may qualify for the Final in Virginia, if the Judges agree that the standard is high enough.

#### The Competition will be judged as follows:

Condition / Quality: 25 points, Uniformity and Shape: 25 points

Size / Weight: 10 points, Colour: 10 points

Overall presentation / attractiveness: 10 points

Judge's decision will be final at all stages of the competition.

  2. Points will be awarded for taste, texture, appearance, and presentation.

  4. The items must be fresh, and home baked by exhibitor.
  5. Two entries may qualify for the final in Tullamore, if judges agree that the standard is high enough.
  6. Non-adherence to tray size will deem elimination of exhibit.
  7. All items will be cut and/or sampled by the Judge.
  8. Each of the successful qualifiers will receive a hamper containing Odlum's products plus a Certificate, on appearance at the final in Tullamore.

- A. Banana Bread (7" Round)
- B. Tea Brack (7" Round)
- C. 4 Plain Scones



### Rules

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1. The Items to be displayed as one exhibit on a base of 2ft x2ft approx.
2. Points will be awarded for texture taste, and presentation.
3. Competition is open to amateurs, male/female, and one tray to qualify per exhibitor.
4. All items to be home made by the exhibitor.
5. In the event of an objection and following an investigation, and if the exhibitor is deemed to be making their living from their profession, they maybe disqualified.
6. A SuperValu Flour wrapper to be displayed with the exhibit.
7. A special qualifying class will be held at selected shows.
8. **Two trays may qualify for the final**, if judges agree that the standard is high enough.
9. Judge's decision will be final at all stages of the competition.
10. Exhibits are displayed at owners risk

Competitors to display three pots of preserves any size  
one pot from each section below

- A. Soft Fruits
- B. Mixed Fruits
- C. Marmalade



### Rules

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1. Max. space allowed 22cm by 41cm, Lids only to be used, no biscuits or scones to be displayed with exhibit.
2. Exhibitor to be creative when presenting their exhibit.
3. Points will be awarded for taste, appearance, sealing, setting and presentation
4. The competition is confined to amateurs both male & female.
5. **Two exhibits** will qualify from each show.
6. The exhibits must be home produced by the exhibitor.
7. All preserves will be sampled.
8. The judge's decisions at all stages of the competition is **final**
9. Exhibits are displayed at owner's risk.
10. For the final fresh pots of preserves must be entered.

***EXHIBITOR OF THE YEAR PERPETUAL TROPHIES***

There are two categories for Exhibitor of the Year:

- (a) Vegetables & Fruit
- (b) Flowers & Pot Plants

The names of the exhibitors obtaining the ten highest aggregates of points in each of the categories (a) & (b) at the above Shows in the open horticultural classes will be forwarded to the Association for inclusion in this competition. Points will be awarded 3 for 1st, 2 for 2nd, & 1 for 3rd in all individual classes. Exhibitors may exhibit at any number of shows but only the highest points from their top five shows will be counted in the competition for each category. Results are recorded & distributed after each show & trophies are presented at the "End of Season Show" in October.

**TIPS FOR FIRST TIME EXHIBITORS**  
**AT**  
**FLAVOURS OF FINGAL**  
**GARDENING & HORTICULTURAL SHOW**

- Exhibiting at the show should be a fun activity and an opportunity to meet others with an interest in Horticulture, Plants, Vegetables & Crafts.
- You don't need to be an expert gardener to produce prize-winning produce so please come along and give it a go...you might be surprized.
- Members from the many Gardening Clubs & Horticultural Societies in Fingal will be on hand to help inexperienced exhibitors stage their exhibits...feel free to ask for advice
- Make sure to read through the Show Catalogue to see what Classes you would like to exhibit and either highlight them or make a list of Class numbers.
- It is important to take note of the number of items in each Class (e.g. Class 304 Potatoes, plate of 5) and it is wise to bring 1 or 2 extra of each exhibit (e.g. 7 potatoes) in case they are needed.
- Points are awarded for Quality, Uniformity & Freshness so for example 5 Potatoes of similar size & shape and of the same variety would be a good exhibit.
- Show vases will be supplied and should be used for staging cut flowers, and you may need newspaper or oasis to keep them upright in the vase.
- Most importantly come along and enjoy the experience and if you win, it will be an added bonus, and a few Euro to spend on next year's seeds!
